CJ is professor in Cancer Late Effect Research. He has established and developed a group of researchers engaged in three dimensions of cancer research: to what extent is the mind a risk factor for cancer, what are the psychosocial and physiological effects of cancer treatment and is it possible to establish new treatments of these effects. The Unit of Survivorship currently (December 2014) counts a total of 34 employees including CJ as Head of Unit, 3 program leaders, 4 senior researchers, 10 PhD students, 10 pre-graduate students and 6 persons working with programming, project coordination and administration. On average 50 peer-reviewed publications have been published annually 2009 to 2014.
